Has New Method For Knitting

Graduate of German School Says It Involves No Lost Motion

GENEVA, N.Y. — "It's all in the way you hold the yarn," says Mrs. H. O. John, German knitter expert, knitter and instructor of a group of Genevans women.

With the hand gear at the New York State agricultural experiment station, Mrs. John is a graduate of the "Handels and Gewerbe Schule" in Germany, a school devoted to the teaching of home economics and the knitting as a fine art.

Knitting is her favorite pastime and the beauty of her knitted wardrobe attracted attention of friends. She soon was busy giving instructions in the method which also says saves a lot of time and turns out a perfect garment.

Under the John system there is no lost motion, and the work goes ahead rapidly. The yarn is held over the left index finger and instead of looping the strand over the top of the needle with the right hand Mrs. John pushes one needle's point down with a finger.

One of the reasons for the fine needlework done by European women is their lack of other interests such as the women have in America, says Mrs. John. Few of the women have automobiles to drive, there are few women's clubs and similar organizations to occupy their time and they do not attend moving picture shows as regularly as do their American sisters.

Debt Increase Exceeds Income
Bank of Canada Gives Report on Provinces

OTTAWA — Provincial debts have been increasing at a greater rate than revenues, between 1925 and 1935, according to a compilation made public by the Bank of Canada.

In 1925 the total indebtedness of the provinces in excess of the amount yearly expended in sinking funds was \$813,400,000. Ten years later, in 1935, it was \$1,622,000,000. The increase was 99 per cent.

Debits have been increasing faster than revenues. In 1926 the debt was 563 per cent of the annual revenue of the provinces. In 1935 it was 777 per cent.

The public debts of the provinces in 1935, less the sinking funds with the relation of the debt to the annual income, that year in brackets follow: Prince Edward Island, \$5,200,000 (481 per cent); Nova Scotia, \$31,100,000 (815); New Brunswick, \$61,500,000 (951); Quebec, \$163,000,000 (463); Ontario, \$699,800,000 (752); Saskatchewan, \$111,000,000 (761); Saskatchewan, \$28,000,000 (41,105); Alberta, \$165,000,000 (984); British Columbia, \$158,200,000 (598).

Man-Made Climate Increases Yield
An interesting application of air-conditioning in its use in the agricultural field, according to the manager of a big electric air conditioning department, man-made climate has made a surprising advance over nature by making possible an increase of 25 to 100 per cent in the yield of certain vegetables.

Vegetables raised under such conditions produced an extra crop and every crop is of better quality, because the air-conditioned vegetable knows no season and is not subject to the limiting effects of heat and drought.
