
Controversy Arises From Appointment

Stratford Beacon-Herald Discusses Question of Male Heads For Women's Colleges

An interesting controversy has arisen over the appointment of Dr. Rowell G. Ham, of Yale University, as president of Mount Holyoke College, Boston, in succession to Dr. Mary Emma Woolley. Mount Holyoke is one of the best-known women's colleges in the United States, and has been almost a tradition that a woman should preside over it. Dr. Woolley is retiring after a long and successful career. This has aroused a storm of criticism, the chief ground of objection being that the appointment sets an example that may extend to other colleges.
Approval of the selection has been given by the Alumnae Association of the college, but that is scarcely justified. There are 7,000 members of the Alumnae Association in Washington, D. C., and it is not clear why the choice was made, less than 200 took the trouble to reply, and that only 150 said so from the women's side. There appears to have been a good deal of indifference at the time, and Dr. Woolley, who has been followed and a woman named, but the Alumnae Association does not seem to have been consulted. A committee has been formed which has the support of Dr. Woolley, and the protest is supported by Miss Dorothy Kenyon, chairman of the American Association of University Women in Washington.
It is felt, however, it is now too late to do anything, and although it is charged that the selection committee was "poached," and that the Alumnae Association was not consulted, it is felt that they did not do the position to three women who declined, and that Dr. Ham was a fourth choice.
Naturally, anything that takes away any of the hard-gains of education and womanhood is sure to meet resistance. Some of the Alumnae Association for professional callings is ever aiming at wider fields. There is almost no profession not open to women, even some of the churches breaking down their walls of prejudice.
One might think that a woman would be the ideal principal for a women's college, as having a better understanding of the needs of the students. Naturally, with girls so young, we have to pick assignments for them and this makes it difficult.



Dominion and Trade Quotas

Canada has certainly made full use of the quotas covering Canadian 700-pound cattle and potato shipments to the United States. Exports of both across the border had reached the quota limit last September, although potatoes continued to be sent through at the rate of 600 per hundredweight, or 150 above the Trade Agreement concession.
Canadian lumbermen, however, did not take full advantage of their generous quota allowance in the United States. Trade Agreement of 250 million board feet of Douglas fir and western hemlock.
