Without doubt, the present Province Wide drive, regarding Forest Conservation and Reforestation, extension, will result in an increased demand for permanent planting stock.

This will mean, that we, at the Saint Williams Forest Nursery, will be expected to meet this demand. The number of milhons of trees developed for annual distribution is directly dependent upon how many men we are permitted to employ at these nurseries, within the confines of our appropriations.

Taking everything into consideration, such as maintenannee, subsidiary expenditures, salaries, depreciation, etc., our records show it costs just about three-quarters of one centn to produce one tree ready for final setting. When a person applies for and receives, say 1000 trees, (just about enough to plantion one acre) he is made a present of trees to the value of \$7.50, by the government. When you realize that some private plantings have required as many as 50 yes even 100,000 trees to complete, you can see what a nice little hand-out this is.

The new company, Trans-Canada Airways, will have the exclusive right to fly mails, passengers, express, on the main artery from Halifax to Vancouver, with certain connecting links to be designed. The Post Office department will sign a contract with it to carry the mails For two years any deficits will be met by the Dominion Government, and after that a rate for carrying the mail will be set likely to allow the company to operate at a small profit. It is expected that it will cost a million dollars a year, in actual operating expenses, to run the route across Canada.

The department still hopes to be gin the western section this summer; all landinng fields are to be ready by the end of 1937.

A committee has now for two sessions been studying the elections machinery of the country, with an eye to reforms. It has rejected proportional representation, the single alternate vote, compulsory voting.
