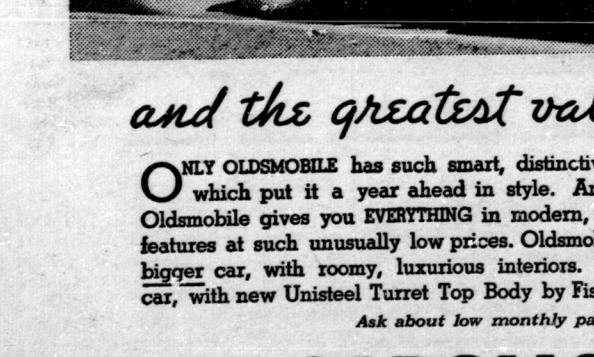
**SCOTTISH SCOUTS' POPPY DAY GOOD TURN**
