The structure in Carlton and Mantley employed the same, the use of which enabled the builders to reduce the weight of the cars by approximately 13 tons without sacrificing strength or safety.

The ice box is used for cooling and the iceboxes under the cars have a capacity of 6,000 pounds. In winter, the cars are entirely air-conditioned or heated by steam. A large tank also under the car, provides drinking water with a pump for forcing the air pressure through coils to a drinking tank surrounded by ice. It will not freeze. The cars are filled with ice on route and there is no direct contact between water and ice.

The cars are equipped with six-wheel trucks "for strength and superior riding quality," as Mr. Johnson says, and will hold 100,000 lbs. and clasp brakes. Half of them will have standard friction bearings and the other 25, truck roller bearings.
