Canadian Eggs

Exports of Canadian eggs to Grea Exports of Canadian eggs to Great Britain in the export season which started recently are expected to ag-gregate in the neighbourhood of one and one-quarter million dozen eggs. The export season extends from the middle of September to the latter part of November and at the end of September short 2000. September about 9,000 cases—3,240 000 eggs—had gone forward.

The export trade at this season is made up of eggs laid in the spring which are held under refrigeration until shipping date. Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Ontario are the chief exporting provinces, with Quebec and Alberta making smaller shipments.
