New Ontario Cabinet

TORONTO.—When the 12th cabinet of the province was formed, Premier Mitchell Hepburn reorganized his cabinet and appointed eight new ministers to his government. Now an augmented and reorganized government of 14 members is settling down to the task of administering the affairs of the province.

All the members of the government who were re-elected retained, ports which held prior to the election. The cabinet includes: Hon. Paul Leduc, minister of mines, relinquished the attorney generalship which he assumed after the resignation of Arthur W. Ross. Although it is Premier Hepburn's intention to shift some of his burden to his colleagues, he continues as provincial treasurer.

LONDON.—Great Britain and France, hesitating at reprisals that might lead to war, decided to put Premier Mussolini to the test, and turned the Spanish "volunteers" problem over to the London Non-Intervention Committee. DENVER.—The American Federation of Labor this week adopted a bill of rights including a trade union boycott of Japanese goods and a demand that President Roosevelt purge the National Labor Relations Board of alleged Communist industrial organization partners.

Appointed to Pensions Board

TORONTO.—Appointment of Dr. James A. Faulkner, former Minister of Health, to the joint chairmanship of the Old-Age Pensions and Mothers' Allowances Commissions has been announced by Premier Hepburn. Dr. Faulkner, who was defeated in his home riding of West Hastings, in the October election will take over his new duties immediately.

Japanese Drive Halted

SHANGHAI.—Veteran campaigners of the old Chinese "Red Army"—now the Eighth Route Army—aided by squadrons of mysterious new airplanes, appeared this week-end to have stemmed the Japanese drive in the Northwest.

SAN FRANCISCO.—R. H. K. Smith, San Francisco steamship company executive, is authorized to aid the search for his brother, Sir Charles Kingsford-Smith, who vanished nearly two years ago on a flight from London to the island continent "down under."
