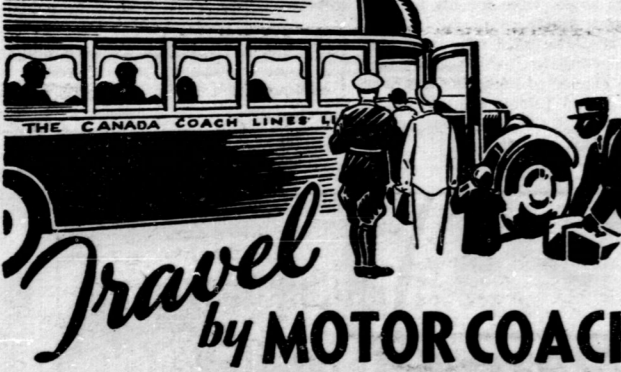

Regular Meeting Of Council Held Tuesday Night

Nomination Date Friday, November 26th

ELECTION DATE DEC. 6th

Nomination was set by the Village Council at their regular meeting on Tuesday night, to take place at 7:30 P.M. on the evening of November 26th. Election day, if necessary, will be on December 6th, the first Monday in December. These dates were in accordance with a by-law passed in 1934, authorizing nomination and election dates one month earlier than was in effect before. 'I would recommend to the incoming Council' stated Reeve Marshall, 'that it would be advantageous to revert to the dates in effect before.' 'I see no advantage in bringing about an election at an earlier date' said the Reeve, 'and certainly it entails a great deal more work for the Clerk under the system in effect at present.' Reeve Marshall's view point was endorsed by other members of the Council. According to the Clerk, it is almost impossible to present a statement to the ratepayers up to November 15th that gives a clear and satisfactory resume of the year's work. Therefore if the present Council are returned next year, November elections and December elections will be discarded.
