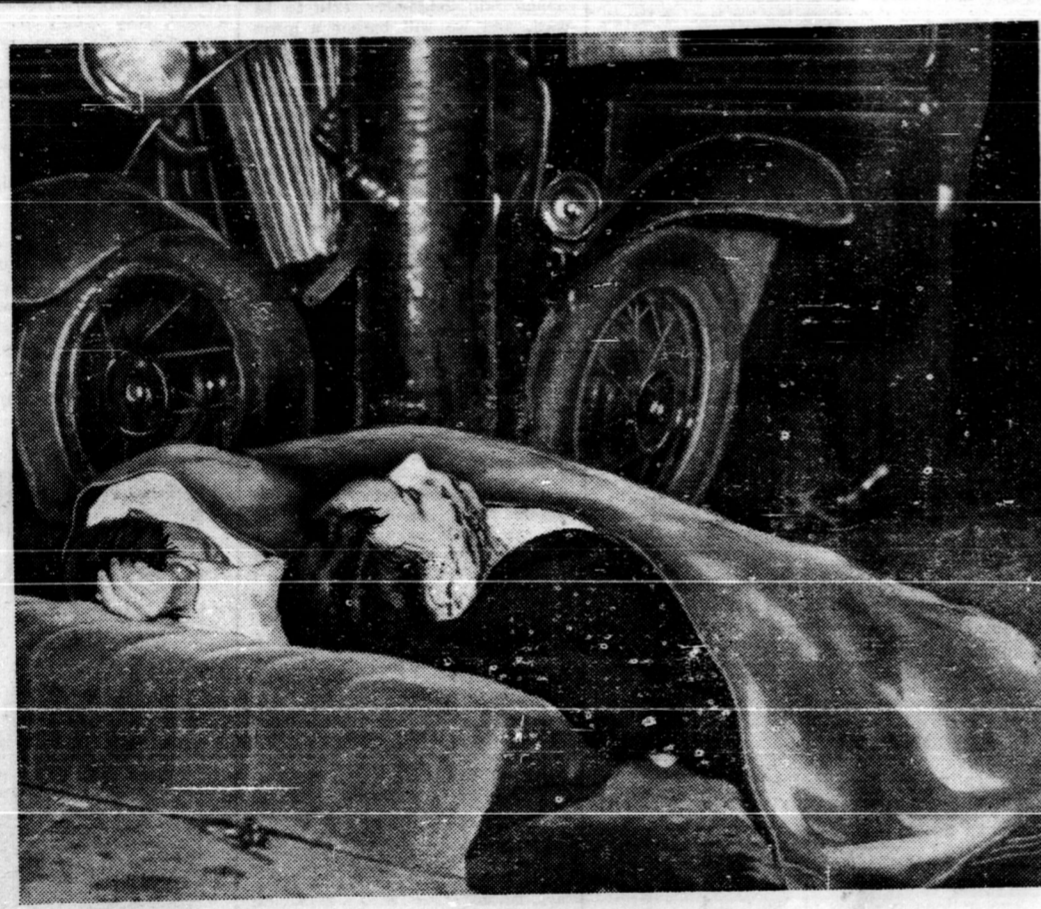

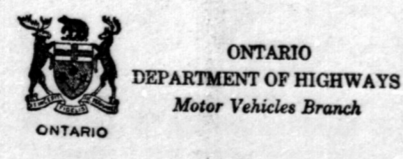
ARE YOU A RECKLESS DRIVER?

The only existing case of Infantile Paralysis in the Township of Walpole and the Village of Jarvis was reported last night to be greatly improved.

The victim of this dread disease, Miss Emma Murphy, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Murphy, of Chesapeake was placed under quarantine this week, but her condition has shown constant improvement. It is hoped and expected she will not suffer from permanent paralysis.

Action Taken as Precaution Against Paralysis Spread

More Cases in Haldimand Per Capita Than in City of Toronto. Parents Advised to Keep Children at Home
At a combined meeting of the local Board of Health and the Board of Trustees on Monday night, it was unanimously decided to close the local public and continuation school for one week or longer if thought necessary.

Sunday Schools Will Also Be Closed Awaiting Further Developments

The closing of the local Continuation and Public School as a result of the epidemic of Infantile Paralysis has been followed up by closing the Sunday Schools of the three churches in Jarvis for an indefinite period. Dr. E. M. Jones, Medical Health Officer for the Village states that all children are requested to neglect the church services until further notice is given.

School Fairs Have Been Postponed Indefinitely

School Fairs in Haldimand County have been postponed indefinitely according to an announcement which has been issued by the local Department of Agriculture at Cayuga. This announcement follows an order from the Medical Health Officers of the County asking that the fairs be discontinued with this year as a precautionary measure in view of the Infantile Paralysis situation.

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
