Japan Ignores Protests

TOKYO—The Japanese government has declined to consider communications from six great Western powers objecting to the bombardment of Chinese cities by Japan's air forces.

Tokyo officials gave no indication of how these representations would be answered, but in Shanghai a spokesman for the Japanese Navy said the bombardments would continue. Great Britain, France, the United States, Italy, Germany and Soviet Russia were the other powers.

Wants Italy's Pledge

LONDON—Having received formal assurances that Italy will send no more "volunteers" to Spain, the British and French foreign offices turned their attention this week-end to obtaining a similar pledge from Italy regarding withdrawal of Fascist troops now fighting for the Spanish insurgents.

Steamer Sinks, Five Drown

NIPICONG—A steamer carrying 140 passengers and crew was sunk in the Strait of Gibraltar by a German U-boat. Five crew members were killed.

Duce Visits Hitler

ROME—While Benito Mussolini's heavily guarded special train rolled northward toward Germany this week-end, intimations circulated that the Italian dictator would visit Adolf Hitler in the Bavarian Alps.

CANTON, China—Foreign flyers, presumably called as advisers to Chinese air forces against the raids of Japanese bombers in this area.
