Changes in National Defence
Department
Ottawa—The most momentous announcement that has broken the midsummer silence of pariiament hill during the past week has been the word of plans to increase the efficiency of the country's defence forces. As has been said in the order of course, on a much more extensive scale, Canada does not intend to be "shot sitting." There will be a gradual and thorough reorganization of the military forces. Boards lof advisers for the three services, army, navy and air force are to be appointed. These committees, composed of men with records of distinguished service will be available for consultation on matters concerning the efficiency of the services. Air marshal W. A. Bishop, V.C., distinguished sirman of the war will be a member of the air board and General Tremblay, famous commander of the 22nd regiment of infantry will serve on the army board. The others on the committee also stand high or the country's roll of honor.

A number of promotions in rank have been announced, among these being W. A. Bishop, formerly vice air marshall to air marshall, a new rank for Canada's forces, Col. L. R. La Fleche, Deputy Minister of the National Defence Department to the rank of major general and Commodiore Percy W. Nelles ranking officer of the navy to rear admiral.

A new vitality is, being instilled in the defence forces. The development of militia rtaining camps has made rapid progress in recent months.
