AROVING REPORTER LOOKS AT LIFE

There is a beautiful story told in one of the latest biographies of that great Scotchman, Robert Louis Stevenson, who, in his last generation, brought joy to countless thousands of people in his life.

Stevenson as anyone who is familiar with his life well knows, was a victim of tuberculosis; a disease which cut his life short at a tragically early age, and which deprived English literature of one of its most gifted writers. When he became convinced that it was necessary for him to live in a dry, warm climate he reluctantly bade farewell to his adopted country, America, and to his native land, Scotland; chartered a yacht, and accompanied by his devoted wife and his foster son, sailed to the South Sea Islands in search of renewed health and a haven of rest.

After many months of wandering he finally found a haven of rest on the beautiful island of Samoa. With his characteristic friendly, sympathetic spirit he entered into the life of the islanders as a friend and as a counsellor.
