It will be very much interested in the trade agreement which was concluded between the United Kingdom and the United States.

As well as Western Canada, the activities of the Prairie Farm Rehabilitation Act will be discussed.

The Canadian people share with the Government its anxiety over the international situation, and view with sympathy the efforts which are being made to promote international understanding and goodwill.

The Government is convinced that in seeking to understand the United Kingdom and other countries in efforts to promote international trade, it is pursuing one of the most effective means of ensuring economic security and progress in Canada and the betterment of conditions in other parts of the world.
