Quick Breads Always Fit In

Man does not live by bread alone. That is to say, not by plain bread. Quick breads are a delightful substitute for bread and a welcome change in the diet. They are easy to make and delicious to eat, especially when served hot.

Here is a recipe which will serve as the basis for many unusual variations of the quick bread theme.

Bismarck Tea Ring 1 recipe baking powder biscuits 1/2 cup raspberry jam 1 cup sifted confectioners' sugar 2 tablespoons raspberry jam. Prepare dough for biscuits as directed. Roll into oblong sheet, 14 in. thick. Spread evenly with raspberry jam. Roll as for jelly roll; bring edges together to form ring; place on baking sheet covered with greased brown paper. With scissors, cut one slice, almost through ring, turning each slice outside up and pointing outer edge. Brush with melted butter. Bake in hot oven (400 degrees F.) 30 minutes, or until done.

Butterscotch Pecan Rolls 1 recipe baking powder biscuits 3 tablespoons butter 1/2 cup brown sugar, firmly packed 4 tablespoons butter, melted 4 tablespoons brown sugar 1/2 cup chopped pecan nut meats. Prepare dough for biscuits as directed. Roll 1/4 inch thick. Cream together butter and sugar and spread on dough; roll as for jelly roll and cut in 1-inch slices. Melt 4 tablespoons butter in 8 x 8 x 2 inch pan, add 4 tablespoons brown sugar, and mix well; sprinkle nut meats over top. Place in pan, outside down. Bake in hot oven (425 degrees F.) 15 minutes; then decrease heat to moderate (350 degrees F.) and bake 15 minutes longer.

Q.—"What do you advise to get the best value from barnyard manure which is taken to the field during the winter months — every if possible, spreading on the ground, putting in small piles, or in a large pile?"

A.—There is bound to be loss from manure, no matter how it is handled. As the ammonia goes off from the manure, nitrogen is escaping at all times. When brown streams of liquid run away from the pile, a very large amount of soluble nitrogen and potash is being lost.
