A Weekly Review Of National Affairs

Ottawa, January 18th. — In the small, unpretentious stone building, which is the headquarters of the federal building on the banks of the Ottawa, and which once a certain there has been a Canadian with the highest court of justice for many years, six black robed justices have been sitting on the benches of the famous Alberta cases.
