Field Meetings Being Held

Owing to the fact that so many
farmers would still be in the midst
of having, it has been decided to
hold the special Weed Cutting Week
later, to be held on the 11th and 12th
of July. A proclamation announce-
ing the date for the special Weed
Cutting Week, was issued by Warden
Vernon Bates and it is hoped that
everyone in the district will make
this special effort to have all weeds
cut during this period.

As has been so often pointed out,
this one week is well set apart so
that the weeds will be cut before
they start to grow again. This is the
best time to cut weeds, and it is
hoped that everyone will make this
special effort to have all weeds
cut during this period.

Thousands of tourists pass through
our county every week and it has
been found that they do not con-
sider it their duty to cut their weeds.
Even our so-called "back country"
are nowadays being invaded by these
weeds. Let us make them more
welcome and more desirable by
making them more beautiful and
unpleasant and harmful weeds.

ing of a number of field meetings and
demonstrations. These will be
evening meetings to enable farmers
to attend. Emphasis will be placed
on weed identification and control,
