

Nanticoke proved themselves to be one of the strongest contenders for the softball cup of the 1938 season when they decisively whipped Erie fourteen to six.


Wray Dennis did some more masterful pitching as he fanned ten and walked six in the seven inning game. Dennis also clouted a triple in deep right field.
