Experiments of dropping fish to 1,000 feet from an airplane to re-stock likes in the Laurentian mountains, have been made by Gustave Prevost, director of fish culture in the Laurentides area, Quebec. He told 600 members of the Anglers' Association of Quebec all about it last week at a meeting in Montreal.

Japan Increases Luxury Taxation

TOKIO.—The finance ministry has approved plans for a special "luxury" tax on such articles as watches, fountain pens, hats, automobiles, umbrellas, footwear and radio sets, it is disclosed.

The tax, ranging between 10 and 15 per cent. of value, will apply to 45 articles and is expected to raise about 63,000,000 yen.


