For the purpose of presentation, the subjects under review were arranged under the following sub-headings: Neutralization; Workmanship; Washing; Packing; Storage and Kept; Quality; Defects; and Laboratory Control.

The lower the churning temperature the firmer the butter. With regard to packing, liners and boxes, heavy financial losses have been incurred by butter manufacturers in many countries by wood paint, surplus of fats, and high cost of sterilization.

Overcome these difficulties, much attention has been given to this subject, particularly in New Zealand, Australia and Canada. Experiments recently conducted by the Dairy Research Institute of New Zealand show that great benefits can be secured from the use of a new butter-making process, consisting of a sheet of aluminum foil sandwiched between two sheets of parchment paper.

On the basis of the findings of these two countries, it appears as if this new type of butter wrap will eventually allow countries far distant from England to land their butter into store there in the same condition as the freshly made butter forwarded more quickly from the dairy.
