Ottawa, May 28.—The annual session of the House of Commons, which was tax interest not only to parliament but to the whole country, will probably be presented to the House of Commons within a few days. The exact date is still conjectural. Budget provisions are always carefully guarded until the Minister of Finance makes his speech, but it may be assumed that the budget will be presented in the House of Commons. It is a very little change in rate of taxation, and by Western members to decrease or eliminate tariffs on agricultural machinery. Whether these suggestions will be followed is unknown, but it is pretty certain that the main tariff changes will be brought in by the House of Commons. The government is making the treaty with Canada and another with the United Kingdom seem not to be in any such haste. It may be a month or more before negotiations are completed.

Refunding of Canadian National Obligations

A bill now going through the House of Commons seeks authority for the Minister of Finance to refund "matured, maturing and callable obligations" of the Canadian National Railways, and to issue in their place new securities guaranteed by the Dominion Government to an amount not exceeding 200 million dollars. The new securities will bear lower rates of interest than the maturing bonds, which of course means a saving to the government in annual interest charges. In the House the Minister of Finance mentioned that the bonds of the Canadian National Government now bear an average rate of 4 per cent. The new securities will be at a rate of 3 1/2 per cent. The total interest on the bonds now outstanding is about 100 million dollars a year. The new securities will save the government about 10 million dollars a year. Mr. Alfred Best, in accordance with his tender of \$6.65 per ton, f.o.b. stone from commercial quarries be awarded in accordance with the prices submitted, the purchase for the individual jobs being allotted by the quality of material and the convenience of the location and other factors that might affect the placing of such purchases.

11. That 422 lb. bituminous seal coat for the road roller and heater be purchased in carload lots from W. H. Lishman, in accordance with his tender of \$6.65 per ton, f.o.b. Cayuga.

12. That the purchase of Portland cement be divided between the Canadian Cement Co. and Alfred Rogers, in the discretion of the engineer.

13. That calcium chloride, as required during the current year, be purchased from the Dow Chemical Co., except as our requirements may exceed two carloads, in which case Brammer Mond (Canada) Limited, additional purchases to be on the same basis.

14. That reinforcing steel for concrete culverts be purchased from the Canadian Steel Co., and that steel purchased for larger bridges be purchased from the Hamilton Steel Co. and the Steel Co. of Canada, alternately.

15. That subject to inspection at the point of loading, cedar poles be purchased from Mr. D. T. Cooper, of 4 to 6 inch tops, 8 ft. long, 17c; 6 to 8 inch tops, 8 ft. long, 24c; 6 to 8 inch tops, 10 ft. long, 30c; 7 to 8 inch tops, 10 ft. long, 35c.

16. That this year's purchase of oak bridge plank and stringers, as well as oak posts for bridges, be purchased from Mr. N. W.
