In 1879 an organ was procured after a vote in its favor being taken by the congregation. Mr. McGuire received a call to Emerson, Manitoba in 1881 and the congregation was without a minister for nearly, three years. In 1884 Rev. John Wells was inducted as minister and in 1886 the corner stone of the pre-

cancy which followed the hymnal was introduced. Hymns as well as paslms were used at the services from then on.

Rev. George McLennan was the next minister. His ministry lasted eleven years and during that time the church membership increased and the building debt was paid of.

In 1898 James Davidson, David Allen and John Thompson were ordained elders. Mr. McLennan resigned the charge in 1903 and Rev. D. M. Buchanan accepted a call from the congregation and was inducted into the pastorate in 1904. During the past thirty years five ministers have occupied the pulpit of Knox church. Rev. Mr. McCfimmon was inducted as minister in 1911 and he was followed by Rev. Mr. Hare in 1916. Rev. W. T. Brown was inducted in 1923 and remained until church union took place In 1926 Dr. D. B. Marsh was appointed minister and had charge of Knox church until 1929, when Rev. G. Lloyd Evans was called by the congregations of Jarvis and Walpole. Mr. Evans is still located here.
