MOKING materials carelessly used are among the most frequent causes of fires. Be careful in disposing of used matches and cigarette butts. Keep matches out of the reach of small children. NEVER SMOKE IN BED.

LAMMABLE liquids cause the greatest number of fatal fires in the home. Never use kerosene or gasoline to start or quicken a fire. Gasoline used in cleaning clothes may ignite from friction or static electricity.

LECTRICITY is safe when properly used, but causes many fires when improperly handled. Avoid amateur wiring as dangerous. Do not overload wiring. Fuses are the safety valves of the system; use standard fuses of proper size. AKE no chance in leaving children alone in the house. They might be trapped should a fire occur. Fires often spread very rapidly. Save Life First.—Let the Fire Department save your property.

LARMS should be given promptly when fire is discovered.

Do not attempt to fight a fire unaided, as it is likely to

spread beyond control.

OUR family's safety may depend upon repairing a defective flue or stove pipe before starting the fire for the winter. Have the chimney cleaned. Wooden shingle roofs are readily ignited; replace them with fire-retarding roofing.

OT ashes should never be placed in wooden barrels or near wooden partitions. Use metal barrels for ashes and for rubbish. Covers on the barrels add to cleanliness and fire safety. Neglect in this matter is a frequent cause of serious fires.

NQUIRE of your Fire Chief, when buying a fire extinguisher, to be certain of getting the right type. Know what to do should a fire start. Never run with your clothing ignited; smother the fire with a blanket or rug. OTIFY the Gas Company immediately in cases of a gas leak or improper operation of gas appliances. Never hunt for a gas leak with a match. Open the windows and vacate the house until the trouble is corrected.

HAWING frozen water pipes with blow torches or open flames is dangerous. Sparks may lodge out of sight and cause fire to spread through concealed spaces. Use hot water for thawing or call a plumber.

TART NOW to save life and property from needless destruction by fire. Support local fire prevention programs. Demand adequate public fire protection facilities, including Fire Department equipment, water supplies and fire alarm.
