This, the first long novel by the famous author of "Marie Antoinette," is a psychological study, profoundly moving, of a beautiful, crippled Austrian girl who falls in love with a young cavalry officer. The young man's pity causes him to form a close friendship with the girl which culminates in a crisis of great intensity.

Tragedy of the starkest kind brings this dramatic story to a close. The two young people become engaged but a misunderstanding drives the sensitive and impetuous girl to commit suicide, and there is an end both of pity and of love.

The lesson of Mr. Zweig's tale is that there are two kinds of pity—the selfish kind that looks and the selfless kind that wounds.
