A.—When baking an open-top apple pie, invert another pie pan over it. This will make the steam cook the pie thoroughly.
Q.—How can I eliminate flies

A .- Placing a castor oil plant in a room tends to drive away the flies. Many people discourage flies by placing in convenient places small saucers containing a mixture of cream, ground black pepper, and sugar.
Q.—How can I facilitate the

pulling of threads from linen? A .- Before pulling the threads, run a damp cloth along the line where the thread is to be pulled. The thread will pull easily while the cloth is damp.

Q.—How can I remove the odor from a knife which has been used for peeling onions? A .- Run the knife blade through

a raw potato, and it will take away the odor. Q.—How can I store quinces? A.—Place quinces carefully in

a barrel, using only perfectly sound fruit. Fill the barrel with water, fasten on the head of the barrel, and put in a cool place. If done properly, the quinces will keep all winter.

Q.—How can I treet perspiring feet?

A .- Put a small portion of household ammonia and the same amount of vinegar into a foot bath. Follow this treatment daily.




What Science Doing
