**The Sailing of the First Contingent**  
Pupils Please Large Crowd

Ottawa, December 13th — It was a grey December Sunday when the first of passenger vessels with the Canadian Active Service Force First Division on board and its accompanying guardian flotilla of warships set sail to sea. At times the sun broke through the clouds, sometimes a squally gale ruffled the waters but the general conditions were favorable and the meteorological experts predicted that the ships would justly avoid a storm area which had been a recent centre of disturbance. This departure was quite different from the sailing of the first Contingent in 1914. The latter had gone out of Valcartier with great ado, embarked on shipboard and slipped down the St. Lawrence to assemble at Gaspe awaiting the word to go. When the time came for the actual departure down the Gulf of St. Lawrence to the sea, that great fleet moved out quietly and with but few observers. This 1939 setting out was under quite different conditions. Instead of the lonely bay the ships were gathered at a port and at a populous place.
