Success of a farm depends on the planning of the business. The farm budget or financial plan is the keystone of the business.

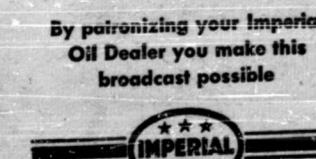
