THE AFTERMATH  
Or What To Do With Left-Overs  
By Katharine Baker  
When you sit down to your New Year's dinner, you will probably find that there is one meal where there will be no left-overs. But when things are finally gathered up and put away, there will be the odd bit of this and that to store away. These odd bits of food will come in handy in the economy program which most of us are forced to adopt after the spree. The left-over vegetables can be jelly powder to make delicious and good-looking salads, which, incidentally, will be welcome after the heavy holiday meals.

The chicken or turkey which you had for the big dinner, can be used as hot luncheon sandwiches, with brown gravy, or in pot pies, croquettes, or souffles. This recipe for chicken croquettes or cutlets will show you how.

Chicken Croquettes or Cutlets  
3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon paprika  
2 tablespoons green pepper, chopped  
2 tablespoons pimiento, chopped  
1/2 cup milk  
1/2 cup chicken stock  
1 1/2 cups cooked chicken, chopped  
Stirred bread or cracker crumbs  
1 egg, beaten with 3 tablespoons milk and dash of salt. Combine quick-cooking tapioca, salt, paprika, green pepper, pimiento, milk, and stock in top of double boiler. Place over rapidly boiling water, bring to scalding point (allow 3 to 5 minutes), and cook 5 minutes, stirring frequently. Add chicken and mix thoroughly. Chill—mixture thickens as it cools. Shape into balls or cutlets. Roll in crumbs, dip in egg mixture, then roll in crumbs. Fry in deep fat (350 degrees F.) 1 minute, or until golden brown. Drain. Serve croquettes. If chicken stock is not available, canned consommé may be substituted or chicken flavored bouillon cubes (2 cubes to 1 cup water).

Matthew 16: 13-25  
Golden Text—Thou art the Christ, the Son of the Living God. —Matt. 16: 16

THE LESSON IN ITS SETTING  
Time.—In the third period of the Christian ministry, autumn, A.D. 29.  
Place.—At or near Caesarea Philippi, in the northern part of Galilee, south of the foot-hills of Mt. Hermon.  
A year and one half, which is about one half of the entire life of our Lord's public ministry, has elapsed between the events of our last lesson and the present event which we are about to study in this lesson.

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## Too Little Beef, Too Many Legs

Department of Agriculture Official Says Canadian Cattle Have Not Been Fed Nor Fattened Up Enough For Market



Too little beef on too many legs has been on big trouble with the Canadian cattle industry, in the judgment of A. M. Shaw, Ottawa director of markets for the Dominion Department of Agriculture.

There has been insufficient grain fed to Canadian cattle to provide "a reasonable level of beef quality or a sufficient regular supply of grain-finished cattle to meet the best demands of the domestic and export trade," Mr. Shaw declared in a paper before the prairie markets conference.

Feed Them More Grain  
He informed the conference, that is studying the lack of markets for western farm produce, that a great deal more grain could be consumed by fewer cattle to the advantage of the industry. An increase in cattle numbers was not altogether desirable and certainly not necessary to a substantial increase in grain consumption, he said.

Fatten Up Your Horse For Sale  
It's a Good Plan To Add a Few Hundred Pounds to the Animal

In fitting horses for Spring work it may not be necessary to fatten them, or burden them, so to speak, with excessive fat, but when it comes to courting a sale at a remunerative price, it is a good plan to add a couple of hundred pounds to the animal. Extra fat on a horse will not deter him from engaging in heavy work, and it is just as well to have the animal in a condition that will always command the best market.

Fetches Better Price  
A highly finished animal may not always be the fittest for immediate hard labor, but it is plainly evident, at horse sales, that horses in full condition fetch higher prices. Buyers will bid for flesh, and it is daily demonstrated that it does not pay to offer unimproved animals for sale. Bidders at a sale will run up the price of an animal that is sleek and well covered. It is therefore the business of the seller to prepare his offering to suit the buying public.
