Hens in Germany must do their best for the Nazi regime. Regi-mented birds are expected to in-crease their annual production of eggs from 80 to 90 apiece to 140 apiece a year. That's an order, according to Canadian poultry experts. While it may be quite an order, unregimented Canadian hens are expected to do their full duty.
