

A Weekly Review Of National Affairs

(By "Spectator") Ottawa June 25th - The political atmosphere in Ottawa remains charged with rumors about a possible election in October. Whether that surmise is true or not remains to be seen. It is for the prime minister and his cabinet to decide. The opinion is held by some that a pretty strong intimation about when the election is to come will likely be given on August 8th in Toronto by the prime minister. On that day the parliament of the Dominion will be celebrating the twentieth anniversary of Mr. King's election to the head of the Liberal party.

While the King and Queen were on their tour of Canada, political "birds of calm sat brooding on the charmed wave." By general agreement the King and Queen are to be temporarily. Now these weapons are out again and on seems to pre-empt the general coming in the not distant future. The leader of the Conservative opposition Dr. Manion is carrying out a speaking tour of Ontario. He is speaking at Haldimand on July 1st at Queenston Heights and on July 8th at the Dominion capital.

The judges of the supreme court of Canada are now considering whether there will be on the question of appeals to the private council in England. The judicial committee of the private council is now the court of last resort on appeals from decisions of the courts of Canada. This refers however only to civil cases. The Canadian parliament has authorized appeals to the private council on criminal matters some years ago. Last session Mr. Cahan introduced a
