Six millions of people in Europe  
are unwanted because by the ac-  
cidents of birth or inheritance they  
have Jewish blood. Even in our  
own country there are misguided  
groups which circulate statements  
that spread a poison of mistrust and  
hate which is antithetical to the true  
Christian religion. Anti-Semitism is  
inherently unchristian, contrary to  
the plain teaching and spirit of our  
Lord.

We Christians have inherited the  
ethical and religious insight of Is-  
rael. We hold them with a difference  
— at one point with a momen-  
tary difference, but we can never  
forget that the historic roots of our  
faith are in the Hebrew people.

Let us pray for the Jews of all  
lands, the stunned, desperate, tor-  
tured victims of demonic hate — es-  
pecially those who are being slowly  
starved out of existence. O Lord,  
hear our prayer and let our cry come  
unto Thee.

My Dear People:  
I address a few frank words  
to you.

Lent has justified itself in Christ  
ian experience.

Since it has proven its worth,  
how do you observe the Season? So  
how will you observe the Season?

What form your private self-denial  
takes is a matter of personal con-  
cern. But let me suggest that your  
public observance be attendance at  
the Sunday service and one of the  
weekday services each week through-  
out the Season. If at considerable  
inconvenience and possible self-sac-  
rifice you follow this advice, you  
certainly will profit withal. Espe-  
cially if you are more to come  
than had you spent an indifferent,  
or self-indulgent Lent.

I suggest that you say daily  
the following special Lenten prayer:

"Teach us, good Lord, to serve  
Thee as thou desirest, to give  
Thee not to count the cost; to  
fight and not to heed the wounds  
to toil and not to seek for rest;  
to labour and not to ask for any  
reward, that of knowing  
that we do Thy will, through  
Jesus Christ our Lord."—Amen.

OVERCOMING EVIL  
WITH GOOD

Thomas Chalmers, the Scottish  
Preacher, entitled one of his best  
known sermons, "The Expulsive  
Power of a New Affection." Here in  
a single phrase is condensed a world  
of wisdom. We attain spiritual  
mastery only as we learn to over-  
come evil with good. A direct at-  
tack upon our own bad habits, or  
the wrong of the world, only leads  
to the battle for the right. Only  
as we put good in the place of bad  
can we succeed in permanently  
overcoming evil.

Social workers are well aware of  
this truth. Passing more strings  
than we can count, but what we are  
more effective is the constructive  
work of character building agencies.  
We shall never withstand the in-  
roads of Communism merely by de-  
nouncing its economic theory. Den-  
unciation will survive only so long as  
our form of government makes more  
abundant life possible for the masses  
of people.

The best defense against "alien  
theories" is not suppression of free  
speech but the demonstration that  
our British ways of thinking and  
living are sounder than the forces that  
oppose them.

So in the handling of our personal  
problems we can conquer the evils  
that threaten our peace and happi-  
ness only as we substitute good in  
the place of evil. Here is the  
meaning of the Lenten season. For  
a period of six weeks the Church  
invites us to experience "the expul-  
sive power of a new affection." What  
ever is wrong in our lives will be  
righted only as we put some positive  
good in its place. So the Church  
urges us to be more faithful in at-  
tendance at public worship, more reg-  
ular in partaking of the Sacra-  
ment, more conscientious in our pri-  
vate dealings with other people.  
These are sure to lead to a better  
life these few weeks of effort  
and devotion and more Christian  
living.
