Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually, creaming well. Add eggs, one at a time, beating thoroughly after each. Add vanilla. Then add flour, alternately with milk. Chill. Roll  $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch thick, cut with floured  $2\frac{1}{4}$

baking powder, and sift again. Cream butter, add sugar gradually, and cream well. Add egg yolks one at a time, add flavoring; the flour. Chill. Roll into  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch balls; dip in chopped nuts or candies. Bake on greased baking sheet in moderate oven (350 deg. F.) 15 minutes. Makes  $3\frac{1}{2}$  dozen.
