major v of seedlings sent out by the Forestry Department, will live, but trees, like humans, must be in congenial surroundings to thrive. Certain trees, Scotch Pine, for instance, will flourish almost anywhere—a national characteristic—perhaps. Spruce red and white pines which are more valuable are also more fastidious as to location. White cedar thrives best where a steady supply of moisture is available. Nut trees, rock elm and basswood require deep mellow soil for best results. Commercially, sugar maple, white ash and red oak are in the front row and will do well on upland. A corder of two rows of evergreens, preferably staggered, is advisable in the case of a new plantation. This will not only add to the attractiveness but will in a short time protect the lot from damage by scorching winds. The Forestry Branch has recently established a chain of demonstration woodlots across the province which are available to prospective planters and students of Forestry.

Owners of those lots will usually be found ready and willing to supplement the efforts of the Department with information and advice.
