



UNTIL a few years ago, snapshots outdoors at night were rather hard to make. Now, thanks to extra high speed film, thousands of snapshoters take them. The fast film plus a fast lens is sufficient for plus a fast lens is sufficient for pocket. These are convenient to carbrightly-lighted street scenes and ry on a hike. They can be used for

flood-lighted buildings.

For outdoor pictures of people at night, all one needs is a camera that can be set for a time exposure, and can be set for a time exposure, and a "flash" bulb in its inexpensive nearer the subject.

With flash bulbs, you can picture flashlight-type holder. a "flash" bulb in its inexpensive flashlight-type holder.

To take such pictures, simply place the camera on a firm support, and set the shutter for "time." Position the subject in front of the camera, click the shutter open, flash the bulb and close the shutter. If the surroundings are dark and there are no lights within the view of the lens, the camera may be held in the hand.

For flash pictures, the camera can be loaded either with regular "chrome type" film or one of the panchromatic films. The distance between the flash bulb and the subject determines the size lens opening you should use.

Here are suggested distances from bulb to subject, outdoors, when you use a No. 16-size bulb with the metal reflector that is a part of the small battery operated holder: for "chrome" type film, 7 feet; for high speed film, 14 feet.
