could never do business with the farmers anywhere.

Mr. Henning contends his farm "income" is more than \$400 annual, or equal to a \$4,000 investment at 4 per cent. On top of that, he has lands, outside what he calls his home, which he has leased; his house, his barns and his equipment.

J. C. Hare's farm is the largest sought by the Government. It has 155 acres, no mortgage, and three gas wells. Hare said the Government agents turned down a price of \$80, per acre, which would figure out at about \$9,000 for the farm.

At that figure, I told them I'd get out if they gave me time to get myself settled on a reasonable price. Hare said, "They turned me down cold and threatened that if the matter went to an arbitration board I'd get less."

"Pair of Squeezers"

"They were like a pair of squeezers. Tightest fellows I ever saw." Hare said of the agents. "They came back on the table and plopped their books down like they was the boss."

The conduct of the agents was "positively rude," Hare contended. Miss Eliza Wain, one of two women affected, has a farm of 115 acres next to the Hare place. Her husband, Mr. McKenna, said the agents had shied away from a price of \$80 an acre there.

## Significance of Present War

Brought Forcibly Home in  
Sad News Received Friday

**FUNERAL TO BE HELD FRIDAY**  
APRIL 5, AT THE HAGUE

The true significance that the present war is universal in its aspects was brought forcibly home to the people of the Jarvis community in particular on Friday when Mr. and Mrs. Emerson Miller received word that their youngest son, Sergeant Pilot James E. Miller, twenty-six, was reported "killed in action" on the island of Iselemond, just south of Rotterdam, Holland, the day previous.

Although the cablegram containing the sad news did not contain the circumstances of his death, news and radio reports give sufficient detail to confirm the belief that Jim was the airman who leaped from his plane after it had been hit by machine gun bullets and set on fire over Rotterdam early Thursday morning.

The machine in which he was in was believed to have been returning over Holland from a reconnaissance flight over Germany.

The machine was a twin motor, five man bomber, and according to reports the other four members of the crew came down safely, although the pilot was burned and another man shot in the hip.

**Admiralty Comments**

Winston Churchill, first Lord of the Admiralty, in a world wide radio broadcast on Saturday rebuked the Netherlands for shooting down a friendly British plane "that had no arms."

"Why, only yesterday," said Mr. Churchill, "while sailors from a British submarine were carrying shore on stretchers, eight encephalitic men whom they had rescued from six days exposure in an open boat, Dutch aviators in a world wide radio broadcast on Saturday rebuked the Netherlands for shooting down a friendly British plane 'that had no arms.'"
