In Dairy Industry

Local Dairyman Advises Against Too Much Optimism in Dairy Industry as Result of German Invasion of Denmark.

When asked this week what ef-

When asked this week what effect the cutting off of the British supply of Dairy Products from Denmark as a result of the German invasion on that country, upon the Canadian Dairy Industry in Canada, Lea Marshall, President of the Mestern Ontario Dairymen's Association, warned against too much optimism.

"There are many factors to consider" said Mr. Marshall, "before we have reason to anticipate a new era in the Dairy Industry in Canada. Naturally Britain will in all likelihood turn to Canada for increased importation of Dairy Products, but first we must consider the Fifty Million £ subsidy the British Government are giving the Dairy Industry in their own country, and secondly, New Zealand and Australia will be asked to increase their exports to the mother country, before Canada, in. view of the advantage in the mone tary exchange."

When asked if Canada could make up the difference in the imports to Britain that will now be shut off from Denmark, Mr. Marshall offered a blank "No." Of course, he said, Canada can increase her pro-
