

A Weekly Review Of National Affairs

Ottawa, August 13th - Parliament has been silent since the departure of members of parliament to their homes. It is however, a deceptive silence because even if parliament is adjourned, the wheels of government are turning very fast. The session will not be resumed until November 5th unless critical events make an earlier assembling of the members imperative. The point about adjournment as opposed to prorogation is that parliament when simply adjourned can be reassembled at a moment's notice, and in these grave days when the world is convulsed by the most deadly war in history, when the life of all free peoples is in the balance, it was thought wise to have the legislature within prompt call. But even if the legislators are now away the work of gearing up Canada's war activities is being carried on rapidly. Whatever shortcomings there may still be in Canada's war effort, it is not the main theme of this review. The main theme is that the Canadian people feel more comfortable - comfortable not complacent, for complacency could be almost as deadly a danger as the enemy's planes and tanks. The main legacy left by the session now adjourned has been a gathering force on land, sea and air and growing activity in industry turning out munitions and war supplies. Among the important measures passed in the last session now to be put into action are the national registration, unemployment insurance and the act embodying the government's wheat policy. National registration of all Canadians over sixteen years of age will become an accomplished fact on August 19, 20 and 21. Young men from 21 years and up will be given military training, calls being made for training according to age categories and as required by the department of national defence. There is as free overseas service. That is entirely a national affair.
