EMPIRE'S YOUTH

Strength of Empire Air Porces Mount Swiftly. Canada's Air Force Which was 4,000 Strong When War was Declared, now Numbers 30,600 -Eight Times as Strong.

In Australia, there have been 12,-000 applications for enlistment in the Air Force since July this year, bring ing the total applications to 132,000. Of 26,000 men needed for ground duties, 20,000 are already on service. The total strength of the R.A.A.F. is now 40,000 — 11 times as great as in September 1939, and 7½ times as great as in May 1940. In New Zealand, the pre-war Air Force of 708 men was increased to more than eight times that number 5,714 in the first year of war. There is a waiting list of 18,000 applicants for enlistment - and 8,000 of those

have applied since May 1940.

India announced in June that she would quadruple her Air Force. The rate of enlistment now ranges between 1,000 and 2,000 men a day. SEVEN GREAT MISTAKES

Domestic tobacco is expected to be used more extensively hereafter. Artificial silk manufactured domestically or in Britain will gradually take the place to an increasing extent of natural silk and its products. Petroleum imports will be regulated by the oil controller.


