When Sending Letters Abroad Make Certain The Address is Absolutely Correct

Misleading addresses on soldiers' mail, now that the First Division of the Canadian Active Service Force is overseas, are causing such letters delay and are entailing considerable extra work to members of the Canadian Base Post Office in indentifying the addressee. Recently postal authorities announced the correct way to address mail to the troops overseas, and to troops still in Canada.

In spite of this much mail matter is being posted which gives the name of certain barracks and also camps in England, instead of the which is entirely omitted. Base Post Office authorities emphasize
