Annual Report of CBC Shows Substantial Operation Surplus

A net operating surplus of \$337,454.21 for the year ending March 31, 1939, was shown in the Annual Report of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation submitted by the Board of Governors of that organization. Fixed assets of the Corporation were increased by \$346,561.18, due largely to the construction of new transmitters in the Maritimes and in the Prairies. These transmitters, CBA at Sackville, N.E., and CBC at Watrous, Sask., incomplete at the end of March 1939, cost approximately \$400,000 and were financed out of the Government loan already voted.
