SENN UNANIMOUS CHOICE OF HALDIMAND CONSERVATIVES (continued from page one) Manion made his stand with respect to conscription perfectly clear in the House of Commons on March 29th last year.

Mr. Senn stressed the importance of post war problems with respect to returning to private life after the war. He said that Canada should not remain neutral and remain in the Empire. Canada should participate to the fullest extent EXCEPT in the conscription of manpower.

Gordon Graydon, M.P. for the County of Haldimand, was the guest speaker at the meeting of the Haldimand Conservative Club on Wednesday evening, February 21st, 1940.

Mr. Graydon, "that Mark Senn has taken the leading part in the Agricultural Debates in the House during the past five years." The speaker said that he recalled very vividly the standard of ethics adopted by party politics and had never come to the point where he sees all good party men and no good men at all.

Mr. Graydon, "I have only one request for those receiving generous allowances under the guise of being a war man." He referred to W. L. Brookington, former chairman of the CBC, being brought back into the Government at a salary of \$10,000 a year, PLUS \$12,000 per year.
