## To the Electors of Haldimand



At a convention in Cayuga on March 8th I was duly chosen the official Liberal Candidate in this election, because, owing to the illness of Mr. Kerr, it was necessary to make a second choice. It was with great reluctance that I accepted this honor, as I had never pooled as a politician. Never in my life has my name appeared on a ballot paper, and never before have I sought any political office or political preference.

During this campaign there is one issue and one issue only—the winning of the war. I am not interested at this time in legislation over tariffs and international trade. My only interest is to assist the present administration to carry on and finish the work which has been started by able and experienced men. Otherwise I would not be a candidate in this election.

Dr. Manion has had no experience in leadership, and has had no training in statesmanship. He has not surrounded himself with outstanding men, although he says he will choose the best men in the country to form a cabinet. Where will he get them? He says Liberals can't qualify.

On the other hand Mackenzie King has been leader of his party for eighteen years, thirteen of which he has been Prime Minister. He has been educated and trained in the arts of statesmanship. He has surrounded himself with men of outstanding ability, among whom there is the best harmony. He has co-operated to the full and complete satisfaction of the British Government in his war effort.

Canada is not an easy country to govern, on account of its extensive area and of the various elements that make up its population, yet Mackenzie King has maintained unity among our provinces. Witness the experience of the people of Quebec during the past few years under the premiership of Maurice Duplessis. So far Dr. Manion's campaign has been one of abuse and misrepresentation. Nothing that the King Government has done suits him. He changes his mind over-night and makes impossible promises.

Compare this with the dignified and eloquent manner in which Mr. King presents his subject, straightforward and to the point—no quibbling over facts and dates, no vilification of character.

Should Dr. Manion be called upon to form a government, no doubt he could do so, but it would take two years for his ministers to familiarize themselves with their several departments. What will Mr. Hillier be doing in the meantime? Germany and Russia would be happy to see a change of government in Canada now. Do not be deceived by the name "National (Conservative Party)"—it is the same old Tory party, as witness the fact that every National Government candidate nominated in this campaign is a Conservative.

Can any reasonable person see the wisdom of changing governments at such a critical time as this? The old story of swapping horses in midstream holds good in this election. But this is not an ordinary stream—it is a torrent. Canada is at war. Mr. King has done, and is doing, all that any man could do to further the best interests of Canada in times of peace and in times of war. He has not wasted the man-power or the resources of Canada. He stands shoulder to shoulder with the Empire for a united Canada. In unity there is strength—the strength that builds up the Empire and helps Canada to stand for all that the Fathers of Confederation hoped Canada would be and should be.

There are also mothers of Confederation—the mothers who gave to Canada her splendid men, the men that have made Canada what she stands for today united in the British Empire in the cause of civilization and freedom. Yes! The women of Canada, the mothers, the wives, the sisters and sweethearts of the gallant men who fought and fell in the World War, and the splendor of men of today who, so gallantly offering their services for King and country, stand firmly by the side of a united Canada as we join our hands across the sea.

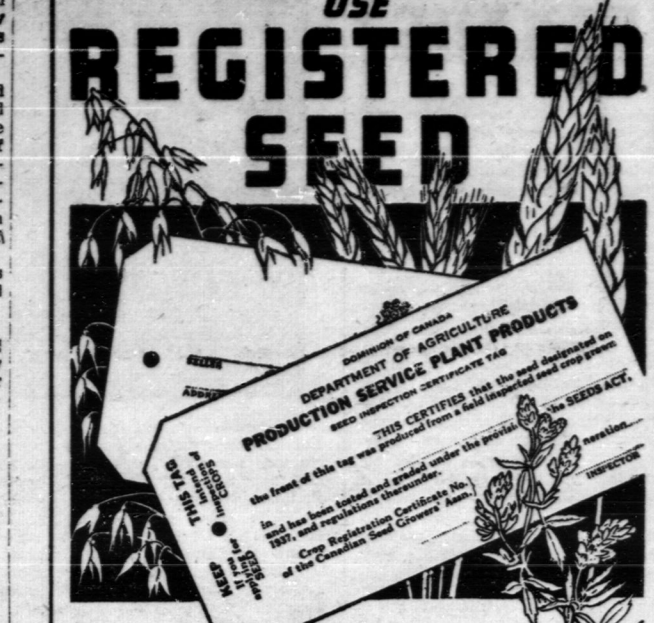

## March of Time Picture

### "CANADA AT WAR"

THE Board of Censors, acting under the authority of The Theatres and Cinematographs Act, Chapter 319 of the Revised Statutes of Ontario 1937, has prohibited the exhibition of the film "Canada at War." In the opinion of the Board the picture is capable of being used—and is, in fact, presently being used in Canada—not for purposes of entertainment or education but for political propaganda. In proof of this, a copy of an advertisement published in Vancouver, B.C., papers under the sponsorship of the Vancouver Liberal Association is shown hereunder.

In the Montreal Star of March 1, 1940, there also appeared an advertisement reading in part as follows: "Special March of Time 'Canada at War', sponsored by the Dominion Government now showing daily 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., Sunday 12 noon to 2 p.m."

Moreover, the film "Canada at War", No. 8 in March of Time features, was released for exhibition in advance of No. 7—which is a picture with an American appeal. The release date of "Canada at War" was said to have been advanced three weeks apparently to permit of the display of the film during the Dominion election campaign.

The action of the Board of Censors in prohibiting the exhibition in Ontario of the March of Time picture "Canada at War" follows the precedent adopted in the Ontario provincial election of 1937, during which time the Liberal Government of Ontario refused to permit the exhibition of films and pictures which gave vivid accounts and displays of C.I.O. activities and scenes of violence in American industrial centres. The showing of the pictures would have been to the undoubted advantage of the Liberal Government which was opposing C.I.O. activities in Ontario. Yet the Ontario Liberal Government banned the exhibition of the films and pictures.

The Board of Censors of the Province of Ontario would be false to its duty if it interfered in the wartime elections campaign by placing its stamp of approval on a film such as "Canada at War", which in this time of grave national peril is being used and exploited for purposes of political propaganda.
