"Before the ink was dry upon the paper. he acted." said Dr. Bruce. "He ordered the lights to be put out in the chamber of the House of Commons, so that when members returned at 8 o'-clock they found the highest court in the land in darkness On a celebrated occasion an English dictator desiring to rid himself of a Parliament which had earned his disfavor, pointed to the Mace, and said: Remove that bauble.' Mr. King added a phrase to Parliamentary history by his message: "Put out the lights.' He put cut the lights of freedom for which our boys are fighting."

Dr. Bruce said the Prime Minister was by instinct an isolaas Minister of Civil Re-Establishment, and did his work so well that ex-service men are behind him all over Canada. Their memories are not short.

Again from 1930 to 1935, the difficult years of the depression, he was the best and most fearless Minister of Railways, Canada ever had. He did not solve the Railway problem. Who could in such a period of economic disaster? But he introduced reason and economy into the management of Canada's national system, and his successor, the Hon C. D. Howe was more than glad to accept his reforms, and co-operate with his appointes. Countless Canadians know him for what he is; a loyal, candid, honourable and fearless patriot. There is no man in the King administration whose record as an administration whose record as an administration outclasses that of Dr. Manion; no man whose career is more free from error, trickery, pettiness or dishonour; or whose record of service in the last war is nobler.
