## CATTLE SHOW, SALE IN LATE NOVEMBER

Guelph Winter Fair Sponsoring Commercial Show of Beef Cattle, Sheep and Swine at Union Stock Yards, Toronto.

The Ontario Provincial Winter Fair (Guelph Winter Fair) in cooperation with the Ontario Department of Agriculture and the Union Stock Yards Co., Toronto, will hold a commercial show and sale of beef cattle, sheep and swine November 29th and 30th at the Union Stock Yards where a similar show and sale of outstanding success was held last fall.

Upwards of \$2,000 is being offered in prize money, states L. E. O'Neill, Secretary of the Guelph Winter Fair. The purpose of the show is to bring together the producers of high class animals with buyers looking for the Christmas trade.

Classes are being provided for Short Horn, Hereford and Angus, each with five classes for each breed on a weight basis. In addition, special prizes are being offered by the Canadian and Ontario Short Horns Associations as well as the Hereford Association and the Aberdeen Angus Association. Prizes will be offered for groups of six steers weighing over 1000 pounds.

Group prizes are also being offered for pens of five market lambs and five bacon hogs.

by the folly and incompetence of government of placemen, faced a world in arms against her.

In that year the placemen, coming with a degenerate parliament, tried to hide from the people of England the hideous situation which knew how to cure. Then Chatham spoke:

"In the present situation of affairs I think it would be treachery to the nation to conceal from them the true state of the country, and with respect to a foreign enemy I know that all concealments are vain and useless. They are as no concealment, and with the actual force and weakness of this country as any of the king's servants. This is no time for silence and reserve."

"I charge the Ministers with the highest crime that men in their stations can be guilty of. When they should have acted they have contented themselves with talking — about it, goddess, and about it."

"If we do not stand forth and do our duty in the present crisis, the nation is irretrievably undone. The whole of your situation. If the information be new to the ministry let them take care to profit by it. Let them awake to nothing but the preservation of their places. One hundred and sixty-nine years ago, the Earl of Chatham made the speech. The date line is London."

Add the year's carryover of 280,000,000 bushels and the total would be 2,180,000,000 bushels available for domestic and world markets. If the present domestic consumption of 1,400,000,000 bushels annually placed at a more reasonable figure of 1,600,000,000 bushels, the surplus would be 800,000,000 bushels. British purchases would amount to a similar figure. If the British blockade continued for two years, he estimated in the succeeding years.

three years about 480,000,000 bushels would be needed for the countries now blockaded. He did not feel that farmers would have a pessimistic view of the future, although the financing of unsold stocks in the country would likely seek the government over \$600,000,000.

The British blockade of Europe, witnessed the bombardment of Britain," Mr. Gardiner said, "I would not advise any government of Canada which would seek markets for farm products anywhere in the world if they marketed within the any way tend to weaken Britain's blockade of Europe." It is our duty to place the food supply of the world at the disposal of the Food and Shipping ministries. In return he felt the British should give for the supply "sufficient to make it possible for supplies which are greatly needed in the country to be carried on producing goods which are essential to the life of the people."

Parliament has now plunged into a long and sharp discussion of what is known as the "Hansard" debate on the food supply. He has laid the broad line of criticism which he has followed by the members of his party. He has claimed that the country has been lulled by the government into a "false sense of security" while those aware of the situation were "alarmed and anxious."

He suggested the appointment of two committees of the house who would report on the exact position of the military, naval and air forces and on the production of war materials and equipment. His attack of the government's war policy was made on a wide front, and he posed a number of specific questions which he requested should be answered in the house by the ministers in direct charge of Canada's war program.
