"In the present situation of affairs I think it would be treachery to the nation to conceal from them their real circumstances; and with respect to a foreign enemy I know, that all concealments are vain and useless. They are as well acquainted with the actual force and weakness of this country as any of the king's servants. This is no time for silence and reserve.

"I charge the Ministers with this pinest crime that men in their stations can be guilty of.

When they should have acted they have contented themselves with talking—about it, goddess, and about it.
"If we do not stand forth and do our duty in the present crists, the nation is irretrievably undone. I despise the little policy of concealments. You ought to know the whole of your situation.
