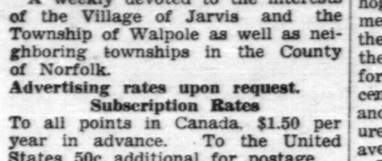

Prices as between agricultural and other products in order to improve the condition of Canadian agriculture.

Adoption of such an amendment would mean technical defeat of the Government and leave it no alternative but to resign. However, with the huge majority it enjoys, there would seem no possibility of such a defeat occurring.

FARM REVENUE LOW
Mr. Senn protested that the revenue of the average farmer is insufficient to meet overhead expenses and maintain a reasonable standard of living for the farmer and his family.

Under present conditions, "no great national long-term policy" could be worked out. Mr. Senn declared that the Government could do much to review agricultural conditions from month to month and see just what branches of farming required assistance.
