YOUNG FARM PEOPLE ARE RAISING FUNDS FOR STATION WAGON  
All Contributions Should be Sent to H. H. Martin, Ontario Department of Agriculture, Toronto.

Ontario Junior Farmers and Junior Farm Women have decided to continue their Ambulance Fund for the duration of the war as a medium through which farm Young People Clubs may continue to contribute as an organization to Canada's war effort.

The Canadian Red Cross Society has advised that station wagons costing \$1,100 each are now in demand in Great Britain and to transport less than 100 cases of injured soldiers.

Rural young people in recent months have subscribed for \$500, the cost of an ambulance and this amount will be used towards the purchase of a station wagon, with some \$500, to be collected.

As formerly, cheques should be made payable to "Junior Farmer and Junior Farm Women's Ambulance Fund" and forwarded direct to A. H. Martin, Ontario Department of Agriculture, Toronto.

Mr. Martin points out the great need of these station wagons in Great Britain at the present time. He states no contribution is too large or too small.

George Bowman Charged Following Highway Fatality  
A charge of dangerous driving was laid against George Bowman of Hagersville in connection with the death of Cornelius Green on No. 1 highway a mile east of Simcoe last Tuesday night.

At the time of the accident Bowman told police that he was travelling east and saw an oncoming car. He stated that the latter was thrown in the path of his car. An officer ran over Green when he failed to see the body lying on the highway, due to the lights of the Bowman car.

No inquest was held and funeral services for the victim were held on Friday afternoon. Rev. A. R. Ferguson of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, Simcoe, officiated.

Bowman will appear in Simcoe Police Court on Saturday, January 4th for his hearing.
