Figures from one small slaughter house in Ontario indicates the change in direction:

In November and December 1939, 200 hogs were brought there to be killed.

In the same months of 1940, 400 hogs were slaughtered with 1,000 unborn pigs. On the farms the slaughterhouse shows there was by the end of 1940 a 30 percent reduction in hog breeding as compared with 1939. with 1939.
