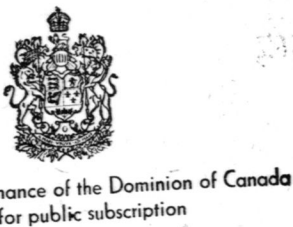
The Rev. L. Douglas Brown was the Guest Preacher in St. George's Church, Guelph, on Whitsunday, June 1st.

FEDERATION COMPLETES ORGANIZATION

The Federation of Agriculture completed its organization at a meeting held on Tuesday evening, May 20th, in the Court House at Cayuga.

This was attended by the directors representing the various municipalities and agricultural organizations of the county. Most encouraging reports of the canyons were received at this meeting. Some municipalities reported the canyons practically complete with as high as 80% of the farmers signing up.

A few statements given at the meeting by the township chairmen and chosen at random are:

Rainham — 80% signed up.

Oneida — Not complete but one school section every man signed up but one.

Sherbrooke — Canvasser on one concession reported every man signed up but one.

South Cayuga — When canvass is completed nine out of ten will be signed up.

Dunn — One school section reports nineteen out of twenty-two signed up.

Seneca — Some school sections report 90% signed up.

A long discussion took place with regard to the continuance of the township units as it was almost unanimously decided to do so. Roger Denning, provisional chairman, presided at the meeting and spoke of the campaign which had recently been conducted and the series of meetings that was held. A ready response was evident on all sides indicating that farmers were prepared to organize on their own behalf.

SUMMER FEEDING PROGRAM FOR ONTARIO DAIRY COWS

Dates Will Vary With Location and Season Says Ontario Department of Agriculture

While dates will vary with location and season, the Ontario Department of Agriculture recommends the following outline of a summer feeding and pasture program for dairy farms in this province.

May 10 to June 10: Pasture fall rye, sweet clover and regular pasture. Feed grain to heavy milkers. Seed pasture mixture with regular grain crops and seed temporary pastures.

June 10 to July 10: Pasture sweet clover, regular pasture, green oats and early aftermath. It may be necessary to increase grain feeding towards the end of this period. Cut small acreage of alfalfa to ensure early aftermath for pasture.

July 10 to August 10: Pasture green oats, regular pasture, sudan grass, millet and aftermath. Use silage, green oats and peas as supplemental feeding. Seed fall rye between August 1 and 15. Increase protein content of grain mixture.

August 10 to September 10: Pasture sudan grass, millet, regular pasture and late aftermath. Use green corn and silage for supplemental feeding. Check shade and water supply.

September 10 to end of season: Pasture fall rye, volunteer growth, aftermath and regular pasture. For supplemental feeding use silage and hay if pasture is very scarce. Keep cows in shelter during cold nights. Trim and harrow pastures. Top dress pasture fields for succeeding year with manure.

General rules: Provide plenty of water, salt and minerals and see that shade is available.

If possible, have pasture for milk section of herd near the barn. Do not overgraze.

Feed concentrates to the heavy producers.

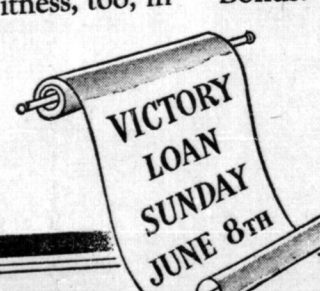
