**CELLS KILL T.B. GERMS**

Discovery of a new chapter in the natural defences of the human body against tuberculosis is reported by Dr. Morton C. Kahn of Cornell Medical College, New York Hospital Association.

This chapter explains what happens when a person is infected by certain wandering white cells in the body which are a person's principal natural defence against tuberculosis.

Heretofore scientists sometimes have thought these cells were passive and containing dead tuberculosis germs.

It appears that the cells contain a chemical, probably an enzyme, which kills T.B. germs, and that the defensive cells can sometimes do so continuously.

The importance of this discovery is that apparently the quality of these wandering cells fixes the ability of a person to recover from tuberculosis. It might be possible to strengthen the cells.
