Fire Destroys Farm Buildings
CHAS. BROWN SUFFERS HEAVY LOSS IN SPECTACULAR FIRE

Haldimand Leads Old Ontario in Hog Grading Classification
"Farmers have the greatest opportunity of making advances in improving the organization of their farm business for the future. The Hog Grading Commission, which was organized at the annual meeting of the Haldimand Yorkshire Swine Breeders' Club held in the Court House, Cayuga, on Friday last, Mr. Hart referred to the present bonus system as being more or less transitory and pointed out that farmers themselves must do something to help themselves. Reference was made to the Federation of Agriculture as a step in the right direction. Mr. Hart's address was both timely, practical and interesting. In his President's address, Mr. Gordon Boulton referred to the progress which had been made by the club during the past year, particularly in connection with the Hog Grading Commission. The report of the Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. Frank Laidlaw, was also very interesting. It was pointed out that there was an increase of 22.4 per cent in the number of hogs marketed during 1940 and that Haldimand producers marketed 29.7 per cent Grade A carcasses putting Haldimand county out in the lead.
